

RULES AGAINST JEWS MULTIPLY IN BERLIN

Further Restrictions on Food and Housing Are Ordered

BERLIN, Oct. 15 (AP)—A new wave of anti-Semitism in Berlin these days is characterized by the following developments:

1. The Jewish Kulturbund, which provided theatrical performances, concerts and movies for the Jewish population, has been dissolved and its artists sent to work in munitions factories, on road building projects and similar chores. Jews already were barred from all cultural institutions available to non-Jews.

2. Grocers dealing in vegetables and fruits may not inscribe Jews on their customers' lists for these two kinds of products. For some time before Jews had been barred from purchasing sweets, condensed milk and many other canned goods.

3. The synagogues in Levetzow and Muenchener Streets, which remained among the few houses of worship permitted to the Jews, were closed recently and all space available inside them filled with straw sacks. It is believed the building will be used to house large numbers of Jews.

4. Some 2,000 Jewish families living in flats and apartments received notices during the past ten days to prepare to leave them. Persons receiving such notices were forbidden to look about for other quarters. They were told they would be assigned quarters when the time comes to move.

5. All Jews receiving the evacuation notice must fill out an inventory of all their possessions, from the pianos to collar buttons. They must fill out a list entitled "normal needs of consumer." The Jews fear that when they move they will be deprived of everything except those goods listed as "normal needs" that include only a bare minimum of clothes and personal articles.
